• **Recreation Interns**

- **Description:** *2 openings. Full time.* Interns would work alongside professional resources and recreation Forest Service employees on projects such as:
  - Attaching nonskid material (recycled fish netting) to the walking surface of a variety of trail structures to improve traction and reduce safety hazards.
  - Ibeck Stream Bank Restoration and the Sand ATV Trail Reconstruction Project: installing stream bank erosion control structures along the Ibeck Creek, spread rock and gravel on boggy areas of the Sand ATV Trail and reroute new trail locations.
  - Annual and deferred trail maintenance: Safety brushing, clearing and water diversion structure maintenance.
  - Sheridan Glacier Lake Trail Boardwalk Extension Project and Childs Glacier North Trail Boardwalk Construction Project: constructing extensions to boardwalks over flooded section of trails.
- **Experience:** 18 or older. Good team player, ability to spend time in a remote field camp in cool, very wet conditions, and maintain a positive attitude. Physical ability to work in strenuous conditions; hiking and carrying gear for 8-10 hours per day.
- **Dates:** Late May-August (flexible). Ability to attend volunteer orientation in late May is ideal. Training will consist of one-week orientation and additional training in tools and safety.
