• **Fuels Reduction Intern**

- **Description:** Intern would go in to the field with one or more agency employees to provide assistance with fuels projects including mechanical thinning/piling as well as gathering pre and post treatment data from multiple project areas. *Full time.*
- **Experience:** Driver's license. Chainsaw certification would be ideal, but not required. Field data collection experience is preferable. Must be comfortable camping and working in the field. College-aged and up.

• **Minerals Administration/Heritage - Field Assistant**

- **Description:** Intern would assist minerals technician in inspecting placer mining operations/documenting inspections and assisting archeologist with field surveys of cultural sites. Experience in archeology or geology would be helpful, but not mandatory. *Full time (40 hours a week).*

Duties would include checking the trap at least once a day, enumerating the fish by species, weighing and measuring a subsample of each fish species. One day a week this task would be paired with walking approximately two miles of lower Cooper Creek looking for adult rainbow trout and any evidence of spawning. *1-2 openings. 2-3 hours per day (includes drive time), 5-7 days a week.*
- **Experience:** Driver's license. Fisheries background preferable. A recent high school graduate or older. Comfortable hiking and walking over unstable/slippery substrates in potentially poor weather.
